3,4,5 authors: Cite all authors the first time the reference occurs. In subsequent citations, include only the surname of the first author followed by et al.

6,7 authors: Cite only the surname of the first author followed by et al.

8+ authors: Cite only the surname of the first author followed by et al. AND in the reference list, list the first 6 authors, followed by 3 full stops (...) then the last author's name.

Gibbs Reflective Cycle

- 1. Description: What exactly happened? Briefly describe the event as objectively, accurately and concisely as you can. Who was involved? Where did it happen? Objectively, in what ways was this experience similar or different to others you have had?
- 2. Feelings/reactions: What did/do you feel about the experience? What were your reactions and feelings, both positive and negative...at the time?...afterwards?
