Health in the 1900s compared to now

Birth rate

- 1901: 3.5 children per female

- Now: Less than 2

Maternal Morality at birth

- 1901: 7.2%

- Now: Less than 1/1000

Infant mortality in the first year

- 1901: 11%

- Now: Less than 0.5%

Common and killer problems for children

1901:

Gastroenteritis, malnourishment, pneumonia, tuberculosis

Now:

Asthma, Obesity, Diabetes, Anxiety, Accidents

Down syndrome

- Extra in chromosome; trisomies
- Simian crease on hand
- Short stature
- Smaller skull

Fragile X Syndrome

- Long face
- Flat feet
- Hypotonia
- Large Ears
- Macro orchidism in males





Prader – Willi Syndrome

- Long head
- Narrow face
- Genetic obesity
- Active on aternal chromosome

Angelman Syndrome

- Excessive laughter
- Smiling happy demeanour
- Stiff jerky gait
- Speech impairment
- Skin and eye hypo-pigmentation
- Deletion or mutation in Maternal chromosome

Williams Syndrome

- Puffy eyes
- Small spaced teeth
- Small upturned nose

Achondroplasia



Turner Syndrome

- XO chromosome; only X chromosome
- Wide neck
- Only Females

XXY Klinefelter's Syndrome

- Only men
- Man boobs
