Consequences of breach of duty

Approval

- Person can avoid breaching their duties by making full disclosure of all relevant information to the company in response to which the company grants through ordinary resolution:
 - Authorisation
 - Statute law and General law
 - Approval before taking the action
 - Ratification
 - General law only, not statute: Angas Law Service Pty Ltd v Carabelas
 - Approval after taking the action
- Approval only available if company is solvent: Kinsela v Russell Kinsela Pty Ltd
- Approval by company does not prevent:
 - ASIC bringing action
 - Statutory Derivative Action: S239(1)
- Approval is not effective if:
 - Director(s) use power as shareholders to ratify their own breach: Cook v
 Deeks
 - If oppressive to members: Hannes v MJH Pty Ltd

Breach of General Law Duty

- Directors owe duties to the company, that is, to the members as a whole Greenhalgh v Arderne Cinemas
- Company is proper plaintiff for wrongs done to the company:
 Foss v Harbottle
- Under General law, only company may bring action for remedies available to company:
 - **Damages:** Daniels v Anderson
 - Account of profits: Paul A Davies (Aust) Pty Ltd v Davies
 - Rescission: Transvaal lands Co v New Belgium
 - Constructive trust: Cook v Deeks

- Injunction: Parke v Daily News Ltd
- If company is in liquidation, then liquidator can bring action on company's behalf

Breach of Statute Law Duty

Compensation order (S1317H)

- May be brought by:
 - ASIC: S1317J(1)
 - Company: S1317J(2)
 - Liquidator (If company is in liquidation)

Injunction for breach of Corporation Act (S1324)

- May be brought by:
 - ASIC
 - Person whose interests are affected
 - Liquidator: AGBC Pty Ltd & Anor v Dessa & Ors
 - Creditor: Phoenix Constructions Queensland Pty Ltd

ASIC - Civil Penalty Provisions (S1317J(1))

- SS 1317DA + 1317E: Civil penalty provisions Include
 - S180(1); S181; S182; S183
- Breach of civil penalty provisions
 - Actions available to ASIC:
 - Management banning order: S206C
 - Pecuniary penalty order (up to \$200,000): S1317G
 - Statutory compensation order: S1317H

DPP - Criminal offense

- S184: Criminal offence
 - Conduct amounting to breach of SS 181, 182, 183, AND
 - Conduct is either:
 - Reckless, OR
 - Intentionally dishonest

- Actions available to DPP for S184:
 - S1311 + Schedule 3: Item 30 Penalty (max):
 - \$360,000 fine (2000 penalty unit) / 5 years of jail / both
