Three Types of Thinking

- Lateral disrupting an alleged thinking sequence and arriving at the solution from another angle
- Logical most informed decision
- Analytical visual thinking giving the ability to solve problems quickly and effectively

FMEA – Failure modes and effects analysis - step-by-step approach for identifying all possible failures in a design, a manufacturing or assembly process, or a product or service

The 5Ws of Event Concept

- Used for critical thinking
- Why must we hold this event?
- Who will be the stakeholders for this event? participants, suppliers, transportation,
- When will the event be held? season, weather
- Where will the event be held? venue, location
- What is the event product that is being developed and presented? delivery of the event

Notting Hill Carnival Case Study

Why – Celebrate Caribbean culture

Who – approximately 1 million attendees – council, local businesses, police, government When – Annually, starting on bank holiday, the last Monday in August and the next two days Where – Notting Hill, London, UK

What – Caribbean style festival that runs over 3 days arranged by the West Indian community, including parades, food, costume contest and music. Overall showcase of culture
