SPORT AND GOVERNMENT POLICY IN AUSTRALIA

Reasons why governments have become more involved in sport in the 20^{th} century

- Raise fitness & physical ability of sedentary population
- Promote national prestige to other countries
- Promote sense of identity & unity, pride about sporting achievements
- Increase support for political leaders
- Promote economic development EG airport line created for Olympic Games Aust.

SHOULD GOVTS BE INVOLVED? YES

- Dom & int. travel → support industries that cater to sport (hotel)
- Policy needed & funding support
- Sport & inclusion
- Anti-siphoning legislation & sport broadcasting regulations

SHOULD GOVTS BE INVOLVED? NO

- Let free market determine sport
- Politics distract athlete performance
- Govt = inc. bureaucracy = inc. inefficiencies
- Govt only regulates for its own good

Australian Sports Commission (ASC)

- 1. Australian Institution of Sport (AIS): training & developing athletes & money invested to gain top elites
- 2. **Sport Performance & Development Groups**: fund NSOs, policy frameworks for sport administration & governance, management
- 3. **Business Operations:** admin of ASC & AIS, oversee commercial services

ASC: MAJOR ACTIVITIES

- Funding & evaluation of NSOs
- Setting coaching standards & edu
- Fund & develop Indigenous & disability sport
- Develop women's sport
- Standards & edu of sporting officials
- Athletic career transition & retire

ASC POLICY: AUSTRALIA'S WINNING EDGE

- 2014-15 investment into elite sport: \$120m
- Fund to win medals at games → 20m
 'redirected' for max potential to win medals in
 Rio
- Winners: swim, losers: football → issue: if not qualified for medal, funding for sport decreases

AIS: CANBERRA

- Worlds best practice in performance
- Contribution Aus' results at Olympic & Paralympic Games
- Athlete scholarships & residence
- State institutions have followed
