Topic 6 The external affairs head of power s51(29)

Rules/tests:

Limb 1: Extraterritorial Matters: power to legislate on matters which are geographically external to Australia e.g. *War Crimes Act case 1991, Horta v Cth 1994*

Limb 2: Relations with other countries: power to legislate with respect to relations with other nations e.g. *The Queen v Sharkey 1949*

Limb 3: Implementation of treaties e.g. Koowarta case 1982

-draft treaties, recommendations, resolutions are supported by this limb (*Thomas v Mowbray 2007*)

Limb 4: Matters of international concern e.g. Koowarta case 1982

Constraints:

- -Treaty must be on a matter of international concern
- a) treaty must be entered in good faith
- b) requirement of sufficient specificity
- c) legislation must be reasonably capable of being considered appropriate and adapted to implementing the treaty.

Topic 6 The defence head of power s51(6)

Rules/tests:

Defence head of power enables the cth to legislate against internal as well as external threats (*Thomas v Mowbray*)

Cases:

- -very broad during war times e.g. Communist party case 1951
- -interim control orders could be issued to suspected terrorists e.g. Thomas v Mowbray 2007

Constraints:

-purposive power, will only support legislation for the purpose of defence.
