Guardianship Tribunal -

What is the guardianship tribunal?

- Est. Guardianship Act 1987
- Protect & empower people with decision making difficulties
- Appoint guardians and financial managers
- Review enduring powers or attorney and enduring powers of attorney
- Provide consent to med/dental treatment
- Approval clinical trial

What is substitute consent?

 Refers to the situation where a patient is not capable of giving their own consent to the medical or dental treatment

Who can not consent?

- A persona cannot give valid consent if they:
 - ⇒ Cannot understand the effects/treatment
 - ⇒ Cannot communicate consent or not
- The Guardianship Act est:
 - ⇒ Who can give valid substitute consent on behalf of patient
 - ⇒ When treatment can occur
 - ⇒ Penalties for practitioners who fail to obtain substitute consent when required

Substitute decision maker -

- Someone who has legal authority to make decisions
 - ⇒ Personal responsible
 - ⇒ Guardianship tribunal

Person responsible -

- 1. Guardian
- 2. Most recent spouse/de facto spouse (close, continuing relationship)
- 3. Unpaid carer
- 4. Relative/friend close personal relationship

Types of treatment -

- Urgent
 - Save a persons life
 - Prevent serious damage to health
 - Alleviate significant pain/distress
 - **⇒ DOES NOT REQUIRE CONSENT**
 - Medical/dental treatment also fall under this if is under those reasons.

- Major
 - General aesthetic
 - Prescription-only drugs
 - Administering long-acting injectable hormone substances
 - Admin. Drugs of addiction
 - Treatment of: cancer, palliative care
 - Suvstantial risk to patient
 - Testing for HIV

⇒ CONSENT IS REQUIRED!

- 1. Hierarchy
- 2. Guardianship Tribunal
- Minor
 - General anaesthetic or other sedation only for:
 - → Management of fractured/dislocated limbs
 - → Endoscopes inserted through an orifice, not penetrating the skin
 - Prescription-only drugs that affect CNS:
 - → Used for analgesic, antiphyretic, antiparkinsonian, antihistaminic, antiemetic, antinauseaunt, anticonvulsant purposes.
 - → PRN not more than 3x/month
 - **→** Sedation
 - → Medications are used only once

⇒ CONSENT REQUIRED

- 1. Hierarchy
- 2. Practitioner
- Special
 - May result in permanently infertile
 - Terminate a pregnancy
 - Results in casectomy/tubal occlusion
 - Aversive stimulus
 - Drug of acciction
 - **⇒** CONSENT REQUIRED
 - 1. Guardianship tribunal ONLY
