# **EXPRESS TRUSTS**

- 1. Settlor: creates/testator
- 2. Trustee: Legal title + perform obligations → Need not consent to appointment, but must disclaim trusteeship if not; MALLOT
  - a. Limitation to 4 in NSW: s 6(5)(b) Trustee Act 1925 NSW
  - b. T cannot be u18; s 10(1)(b) Conveyancing Act 1919 NSW
  - c. Person underage not able to enter into contracts which bind the trust; Minors (Property & Contracts) Act 1970 NSW
  - d. Bankruptcy provides grounds for T's removal; MILLER
- 3. Beneficiary

### Classification

- 1. Express trust; (private)
  - a. Fixed trusts; Beneficiaries defined, ascertainable & benefit is fixed or defined equitable prop interests
  - b. Discretionary trusts; T disc. to apply income/capital of T to B = choose out of class, &/or, decide how much will receive no eq. int
  - c. Executed v executory trusts; express intention; i.e. in a trust deed, & give property to trustee
    - i. Executory; in process of being formed
    - ii. Executed; everything done & trust in place sign doc not enough, need transfer prop
  - d. Bare trust; T do nothing than hold property & transfer B when B asks for it
- 2. Non-express trust: Constructive trusts; used by law as a remedy, OR Resulting trusts; implied intention by the law
- 3. Inter vivos v testamentary trusts; Inter vivos; Amongst living <u>declaration</u> of trust; OR, by <u>transfer</u> of prop & Testamentary; wills

### **Essential characteristics**

- 1. T distinguishable from gift to B;
  - a. Once gift made all legal rights & obligations affecting subject-matter of gift vest in donee
  - b. B's of trust not immediately entitled to property; needs to be transferred or otherwise disposed
- 2. Trust, of itself, has no legal personality;
  - a. T holds property on behalf of trust & trust activities are conducted through him
  - b. Actions in contract & tort can only be brought against the trustee, & not the trust
- 3. Towes FO to the B;
  - a. T is subject to 'no conflict' & 'no profit' prohibitions
  - b. T may owe FO to unascertained beneficiaries i.e. unborn children
- 4. SAUNDERS rule
  - a. ALL B of full age & capacity terminate trust by requiring T to transfer assets/at their direction
    - i. Overrides any terms contained in trust instrument
    - ii. Operates regardless of whether trustees are opposed to termination
  - b. NOT apply to disc. T only applies where B entitled to whole benef. int. in prop; CPT CUSTODIAN

## 3 certainties; KNIGHT

### 1. Intention

- a. Real intention (obligation), not a gift or loan, is necessary; WYATT
- b. Settlor need not have used word 'trust'; RE ARMSTRONG
- c. Cannot be created with precatory words obligation must be clearly imposed; WILLIAMS
- d. Inference drawn if settlor intended to create one; PAUL v CONSTANCE
- e. Intention to create a trust must take effect immediately
- f. <u>Exception</u>: where **valuable consideration provided**, is enforceable by the intended trustee & there is no bar to specific performance lack clean hands or delay; **HARPUR**
- g. Objectively ascertained; BYRNES v KENDLE
- h. Whether contract creates a trust is determined objectively; **SHORTALL**
- i. <u>Sham trusts:</u> **s 37 CONVEYANCING ACT 1919 NSW:** "Every alienation of property with intent to defraud creditors shall be voidable at the instance of any person thereby prejudiced"
- j. "Acts done or docs executed...to 'sham' which are intended to give 3<sup>rd</sup> parties or court appearance of creating b/n part. legal rights & obligs dif from actual leg rights & obligs (if any) which parties intend to create" Lord Diplock **SNOOK**

### 2. Subject matter

- a. Must be legally recognised real or tangible, cannot be an expectancy
  - i. Expectation of receiving property under will; NORMAN
  - ii. Expectation of receiving property as B under DT; KENNON
- b. Quantum of property must be clearly defined; PALMER
  - iii. Must be specified with reasonable certainty objectively assessed; RE GOLAY'S TRUST
  - iv. SM certain where goods segregated/define from bulk; RE GOLDCORP EXCHANGE
  - v. T sufficiently certain if property consists of a % or fraction of fungible property; **HUNTER**
