Latin Terms and Definitions

<i>bis</i>	"repeat" means it's the second version of the protocol
<i>dolus specialis</i>	"special intent" - in regards to genocide
<i>dolus directus</i>	"direct intent" -
<i>dolus eventualis</i>	awareness of the likelihood of an outcome with an action
<i>ejusdem generis</i>	"of the same kind" eg. in a contract where a damage exclusions are 'act of god, flood, fire or otherwise', otherwise would have to be in the same class as the preceding examples
<i>in absentia</i>	"in the absence" - a person who is subject to criminal proceedings in a court of law but is not physically present at those proceedings is said to have undergone trial in absentia
<i>jus ad bellum</i>	"right to war" the rules that are applicable before a war
